Master's Double Major Program Regulations of the Department of Philosophy

Article 1: These regulations are established according to the university's "Regulations for Students Pursuing Double Majors."

Article 2: Qualifications and Procedures

1. Graduate students from other departments (institutes, programs) of the university who wish to pursue a double major in our department should apply within the university's designated application period to their original department (institute, program). Upon verification of the ability to pursue a double major, approval from our department head is required before submission to the Dean of Academic Affairs for final approval.
2. Graduate students of our department who wish to pursue a double major in another department (institute, program) should apply within the university's designated application period to both our department and the relevant department (institute, program) according to the regulations of our department and the respective department (institute, program).
3. When applying to our department, in addition to the application form, the following documents must be submitted:
 - Transcript of the previous semester (or academic year).
 - Statement of purpose.

Article 3: Course Requirements

1. Required Credits:

Students pursuing a double major with our department must fulfill graduation requirements of their original department (institute, program) and complete a total of 15 credits from professional courses offered by our department, including 3 credits of required courses.

2. Qualification Evaluation: Must pass evaluation of thesis content and structure conducted by our department.

3. master's Thesis:

Students pursuing a double major with our department must meet the relevant regulations of the university's "Regulations for Graduate Degree Examinations" and must submit and defend two separate theses with distinct topics and content—one for the original department (institute, program) and one for our department. The thesis defense for the original department (institute, program) must be completed and passed before proceeding to defend the thesis for our department.

Article 4: Any matters not covered by these regulations shall be handled according to the relevant regulations of the Ministry of Education and the university.

Article 5: These regulations shall be approved by the departmental affairs meeting and reported to the educational affairs meeting for endorsement before implementation; the same process applies to any revisions.
