

### 學習







Lecturing in English in all mandatory course in graduate school now!




#### Radio



## English caption!

  - TED and TV shows captions are pretty good in comparing with other sources.

Never turn on the Chinese caption!

## Problems on listening?


- Accent

- Watch the video again with no caption





## Progress

- 1st stage: Pick up the words
- 2<sup>nd</sup> stage: Get used to the speed
- 3<sup>rd</sup> stage: Pick up the sentences
- 4<sup>th</sup> stage: Understand the meaning
- 5<sup>th</sup> stage: Expanding vocabulary
- 6<sup>th</sup> stage: Think in English
- Last stage: Watch a comedy video and laugh with the jokes!
