All the talks are

Informative

Well-structured

• Provide new knowledge

· Speaking are relatively slow and clear

How to control

someone else's arm with your brain

- Good captions
- Generally short! <~15min!

## English caption!

- It's good to help you catching the words.
- But be warned. It maybe wrong.
  - TED and TV shows captions are pretty good in comparing with other sources.
- Never turn on the Chinese caption!


- Accent

- 5th stage: Keep expanding vocabulary
- 6th stage: Think in English
- Last stage: Watch a comedy video and laugh with the jokes!
