Lecturing in English in all mandatory course in graduate school now!


Radio

News

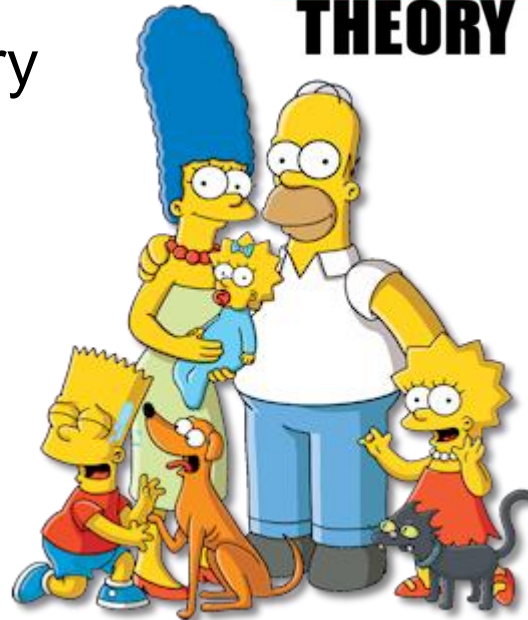
- Many sources

TV shows

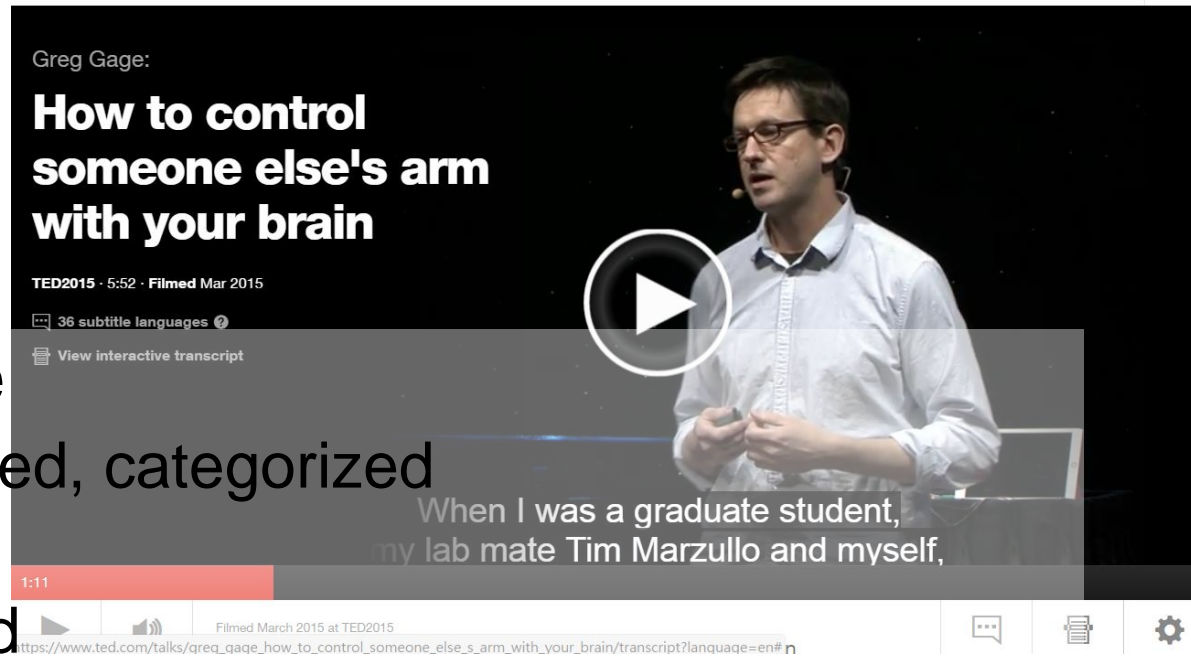
- Mostly entertainment oriented

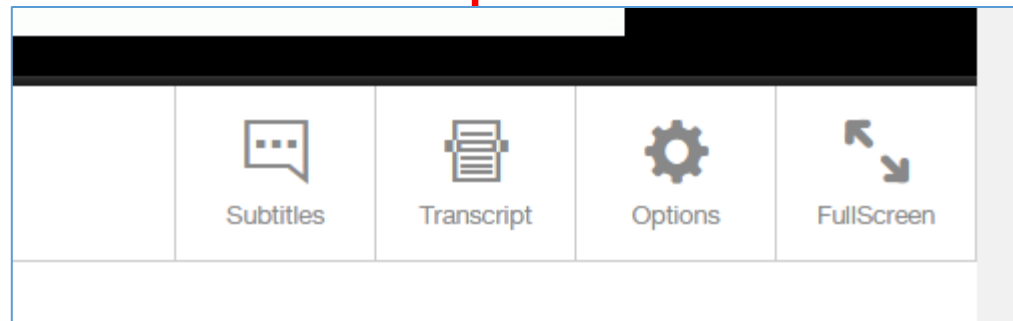
TED

- All the talks are
 - Selected, filtered, categorized
 - Informative
 - Well-structured
 - Provide new knowledge
- Speaking are relatively slow and clear
- Good captions
- Generally short! <~15min!



English caption!

- It's good to help you catching the words.
- But be warned. It maybe wrong.
 - TED and TV shows captions are pretty good in comparing with other sources.
- **Never turn on the Chinese caption!**

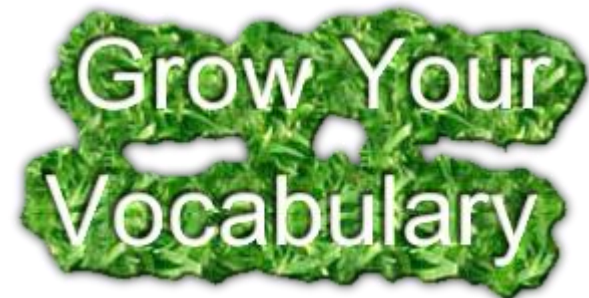
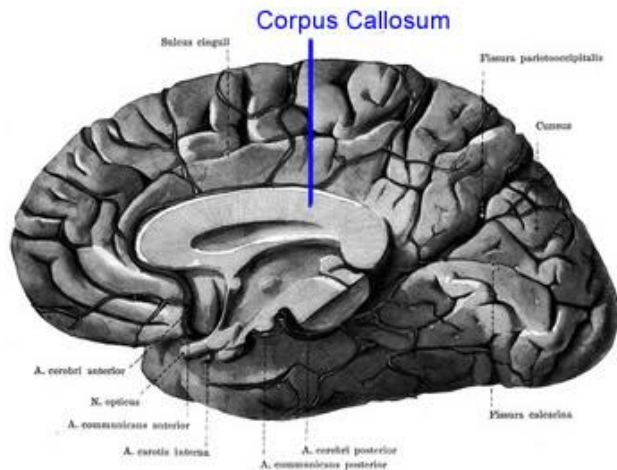
- Accent

Vocabulary

- When some new word come out,
 - Do not stop and look it up every time.
 - Try to **guess** the meaning of the word.
 - Try to write down and **guess** how it is spelled.
 - Look it up using google
 - Google will correct your spelling
 - Look up **pictures**, not translation



Suggested Process

- Watch the video with no caption first
- Watch the video again with caption
- Watch the video again with no caption



Progress

- 1st stage: Pick up the words
- 2nd stage: Get used to the speed
- 3rd stage: Pick up the sentences
- 4th stage: Understand the meaning
- 5th stage: Expanding vocabulary
- 6th stage: Think in English
- Last stage: Watch a comedy video and laugh with the jokes!
